- ✓ Entry 41-21: The Victor number 27617 is false. THE BROWN-SKIN GAL and JUMP FOR JOY (-1) are both on Victor 27517. (Aasland)
- ✓ Entry 42-1: PERDIDO is also on RCA VPM-6042-1. (Aasland)

ADDITIONS:

- ✓ Alamac QSR-2404 also released on James 18004. (Wilson)
- ✓ Entry 41-32: All selections also on Diversity 6104 and on Joker 3120. (Wilson)
- ✓ Extreme Rarities ER-1002 "HOT JAZZ ON FILMS" Vol. 1 should be added to the "Microgroove Listing" section. Has 10 DE tracks: Dec41: Hot Chocolate/Jan Bessie. (Entry 41-33). (Aasland)
- ✓ The label Jazz Moderne (issue number?) has 26Jul40: Harlem Airshaft/...etc.../2Nov40: Pyramid/...etc... (San Filippo)
- ✓ Black Jack 3004 has 22Jul42: Things Ain't What They Used To Be/(Balance not known). Add to the "Microgroove Listing" section. (Aasland)
- ✓ The AFPS transcription "Basic Musical Library" Vol. 466 has 16May45: Every Hour On The Hour/5Jul41: Time's A Wastin'/(Balance not by DE). (Aasland)
- ✓ Entry 40-47: The Jazz Society AA-520/-521 now issued in Japan on Philips BT-5279/-5280. (Hallstrom)
- ✓ Dick Bakker's "Micrography" reports, a.o. two Japanese RCA sets: "The Duke Ellington Story" 1940-1945 on RCA RA-36 - RA-44, beginning with YOU, YOU DARRIN, up to and including MIDRIFF, and "The Essence Of Small Groups" on RCA RA-75 & RA-78 with Hodges, Bigard and Stewart units. Another RCA release, CL-42237, has selections from this Victor period.

DISCUSSIONS / COMMENTS:

- ✓ Could the Jazz Guild 1006 selections listed as from 7 Sep 40 (see entry 40-24) be the same as from 5 Oct, 40 (see entry 40-41), or vice versa? (Hallstrom)
- ✓ Entry 40-47: There is no "Lake Inn" in Fargo. Who dreamed up this location? (Towers)

SOME INTERESTING NEW RELEASES FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

Of course you are aware of the Capitol Transcriptions now released on 5 LP:s on Hindsight Records and in Europe available on Decca!

We will also inform you concerning a 5 LP-Set, "DUKE ELLINGTON 1899-1974", released by M.F. Distribution Co., in association with Tele-Group Marketing, Inc. These are live and studio stereo recordings. The Set offers no date concerning the selections but inside you'll find comments by Stanley Dance. This set can not be found in ordinary stores, oddly enough.

Another very interesting hard to get item is a polish LP release with selections from Duke's visit there in 1971. The LP is called "LAST TIME" "DUKE ELLINGTON ORCHESTRA". The label is "POLJAZZ", released by the Polish Jazz Socie Recorded (stereo) in Warsaw, 30 Oct 71, at the Kongress Hall. (Poljazz Z-SX 0673).

You may also keep in mind "THE ELEGANT MISTER ELLINGTON" released on Swing House SWH-4 (english label) presenting selections from the 1959 Berlin Concert (mono).

Also observe "THE DUKE AT CORNELL", Vol.1, on Densor Disc 448-1, from the Dec 10th, 1948, with selections not previously released. (Aasland)

Next DEMS BULLETIN will, among other things, offer a free Duke LP (only for members). It will also contain further additions, etc., as well a small Ellington collection for sale, consisting of 78:s, EP:s and LP:s. Maybe something for you there?!
