

Duke Ellington And Orchestra Are to Play Here

Negro Pianist, Conductor and Composer Has Just Completed a Long European Tour

The same company and show intact that excited patrons of theatres in England, from the Prince of Wales on down, will be brought to the Waco theatre for the Duke Ellington engagement starting Nov. 1. The negro pianist, conductor and composer has just returned to this country from a tour of England with his famous orchestra and company of entertainers and is now holding several eastern engagements before starting his southern tour.

Ellington's particular brand of entertainment already is familiar to those who live in the east and to visitors in New York. Primarily a dance band, with a distinctive rhythm and tempo and special arrangements that no other band can play and very few attempt, the Ellington orchestra became a stage sensation from the time of its first appearance on the vaudeville stage at the Palace theatre in New York City. Since that time the negro group has appeared in the largest theatres in the east and midwest in addition to its engagements at the Cotton club in Harlem.
