

BAND IS HELD BEST OF KIND

DUKE ELLINGTON'S MUSICIANS
COMING HERE ON
JULY 8

Critics of modern music proclaim that the nation's finest body of negro musicians are brought together in Duke Ellington's orchestra, the premier group that is coming to Amarillo for a concert and dance Monday night, July 8.

Duke Ellington is an accomplished composer as well as director. His own selections, some of the most popular numbers today, will be featured in the concert program and at the dance.

The concert here July 8 will begin at 8:15 P. M. The entire balcony has been reserved for colored folk. All parquet and balcony tickets will be sold for 55 cents each during the advance sale that will end at 6 P. M. the night of the performance.

Miss Lois Black will take reservations for parquet seats at The News-Globe. Colored folk may obtain the balcony tickets at the Corner Drug Store, 118 Harrison Street.

All tickets sold at the Auditorium the night of the show will cost 85 cents each.

Following the concert Ellington's orchestra is to play for a dance at the Nat. Admittance will be \$1.65 per person, \$3.20 a couple, and \$2.50 for stags.
