NEEDLE in the GROOVE

We applaud a new disc firm, Monitor, of New York City, for initiating a series of recordings by renowned Russian artists in works we do not often hear in "Live" concerts. Typical is the 12-inch album (MC-2004) which features the enormously gifted pianist Sviatoslav Richter in the Rachmaninoff First Piano Concerto and Saint-Saens' Fifth, two of the most fiery virtuosi scores in the repertory. His playing hearkens back to the days of the pianistic giants like Busoni. The music itself is highly rewarding to the listener: drama, breathtaking technique and emotional verve characterize these fine concertos. Excellent sound from Russian-made tapes.

Your critic admits that he has a particular soft spot for Russian basses, ever since he first heard the late Feodor Chaliapin. Many have sought the mantle of this immortal singer (who created the role of "Boris Godunov" in a d'Elto's "Mefistofele"), but not even Slepko or Rossi-Lemmon have approached winning it. However, Ivan Skobtsov, who makes his debut on Monitor MC-2001, has a thrilling range and power of expression, as he reveals in nine traditional Russian folk songs which include "Song of the Volga Boatmen" and "Along the Perekhaya Road."

A SPECIAL treat on this disc is his singing of the never-before-recorded "The Barge-Haulers" which Sergei Rachmaninoff arranged. The orchestra includes genuine Russian balalaikas, domras and other folk instruments. Superb sound and a listening delight you won't want to miss!

Victor has two wonderful jazz 12-inch plates for the collector and anybody else who enjoys great basic jazz. One is "In a Mellotone" by Duke Ellington and his orchestra. Sixteen sides which he did from 1940 to 1942 — his greatest period, as regards band personnel as well as his own creative impulse — make this disc (LPM-1364) one of the truly prize issues on lp. For instance, hear him do "All Too Soon," with Ben Webster's gorgeously mellow tenor sax, or "Cotton Tail" with an even more electrifying giveout by Webster; or the immortal "I Got It Bad" with the late Ivie Anderson singing as only she could. Get it!

THE OTHER Victor jazz waxing is "Rhythm Was His Business," (LMP-1301) in which George Williams and his orchestra pay tribute to Jimmie Lunceford, who died in 1947 and brought to an end one of the most original of all major jazz bands.

Williams arranged for that aggregation, and has caught the spirit of that incomparable musician. In "Till Take the South," Jimmy Crawford, who played Drums in that combo, shows the authoritative beat that every jazz fan cheered; 2-beat rhythms with sly afterbeat was the basic theme that Lunceford featured in his versions. There's "Swingin' on C" with Al Cohn, taking a luscious tenor sax solo; "Fate Heat" which won Jimmie fame back in 1934 is given its original styling on this superb hi-fi waxing. Don't miss it!

ANITA EKBERG dances in Columbia Pictures' "Zazou," which also co-stars Victor Mature and Michael Wilding at the Des Plaines theatre in color by Technicolor and CinemaScope. The new adventure-spectacle is a Warwick Production. Opens Friday for 7 days. (Bill)

Isturbi, Ellington On the Keyboards In Benefit Concert

Jose Isturbi, world-famous virtuoso, will combine talents with Duke Ellington and his band in a unique benefit concert April 3 at Medinah Temple.

Called "Panorama," the concert is sponsored by the Chicago chapter of the national multiple Sclerosis society. The concert will offer piano music from Mozart to modern jazz. Both Isturbi and Ellington will be featured at the keyboard.

Proceeds of the affair will go to support the work of the Chicago Chapter, which maintains a multiple sclerosis clinic at Procyberian-St. Luke hospital. Money raised will also help finance research into multiple sclerosis now being conducted by the University of Illinois Research Center. Last year \$68,000 was raised by a "50 Years of Jazz" concert, starring Helen Hayes and Louis Armstrong. (Bill)
