

Duke Ellington, Band To Appear Here Aug. 10

Recent announcement from Assumption High School, that the music department is sponsoring the appearance here, Aug. 10, of the famed Duke Ellington and his Columbia Recording Band, has evoked a great deal of interest from both adults and young people.

For his music finds favor not only with students of music, lov-

ers of "le jazz hot" and intellectuals, but with the general public whose early approval meant eventual success.

Ellington's compositions are considered listening classics for the deep personal emotions they impart. When the Duke sits down and dashes off a cavalcade of his own hits, audience applause is not only a tribute to his genius—listeners frequently connect an Ellington classic with an experience of their own.

Thus "Black and Tan Fantasy" might recall a romantic meeting, or the mood might change from "Sophisticated Lady" to "I Got It Bad and That Ain't Good."

Ellington and his orchestra have made many request appearances in recent years, on the U. S. Steel TV hour, the Ed Sullivan TV show, at the Newport and Madison Square Garden Jazz Festivals, and at the Yale Bowl.

The two-hour show here in the Assumption auditorium will begin at 8:30 p.m. All seats have been reserved, but the price range should permit all to enjoy this mid-summer treat.
