There is no name on the list of the world's greatest in music today that has not paid tribute to the genius of Duke Ellington, who will be playing an engagement at Assumption High School on Thursday, Aug. 10.

Among them have been Constant Lambert, leading London music critic and composer, Percy Grainger, head of the music department of New York University, Leopold Stokowski, Lauritz Melchior, Debuss, Jose Iturbi and a host of others

But the compliment to his music that the Duke values most highly among all the others is that paid him by the renowned George Gershwin in one of Oscar Levant's favorite recollections of his friend.

Lewant, himself a great admirer of Ellington, tells of the many hours that Gershwin spent in the company of Ellington's music, sometimes playing Ellington compositions at his piano, but more often sitting quietly, listening to the many Ellington records which he owned and prized so highly that they were kept completely separate from the hundreds of others in his music room

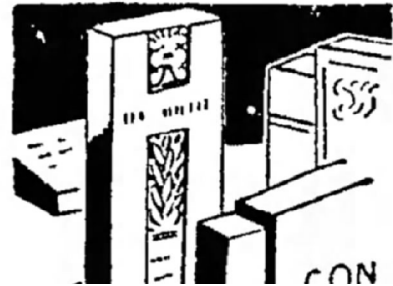
