A decision to turn on the decorative Christmas lights in Brownsville Borough was made at this week's reorganizational meeting of the Brownsville Area Chamber of Commerce.

Merchants would like to have the lights on beginning today from 6 to 9 p.m. along with lights on Christmas Eve, New Year's Eve and Russian Christmas (Jan. 7).

The lights were put up in the borough after Thanksgiving, but they were not turned on because of the energy crisis. However, merchants did not decorate their store windows this year and were not using any additional electric power.

A spokesman said West Penn Power Co. left the decision to turn on the Christmas lights up to the Chamber of Commerce.

Merchants noted that lights have been turned on in some of the smaller boroughs, such as California.

The Chamber of Commerce retained the same officers it had last year.

6 Die In Home Fire

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — A young mother whose electricity was cut off for nonpayment died with her five children in a home fire Wednesday which a candle tipped over and set fire to their apartment.

Police and Elizabeth Forest, 23, and her children, who ranged in age from 1 to 8, apparently were asleep when the early morning fire engulfed their apartment on the second floor of a two-story wood frame house.

Eight other relatives living in a first-floor apartment escaped unharmed.

The six bodies were found huddled beneath a bed. Authorities said a preliminary autopsy indicated they died from smoke inhalation.

Essie Mae Walker, the children's grandmother, told authorities that the children were grandfathered since birth and she was unable to pay for them.

A spokesman for Orlando Utilities said electric service to the Forest apartment had been switched off Tuesday for non-payment of a \$29.11 bill which had been overdue since Nov. 27.

Fire officials said a candle used for light tipped over as the family slept, apparently igniting a plastic cover on a chest of drawers.

The children's grandfather, Clarence Walker, said he tried to get to the window of the burning apartment and shouted for the children to slide down. But he said they were too frightened and could not understand what he wanted them to do.
